This is only a **DRILL** so that staff and students can practice what to do in the event of an unsafe situation that requires this level of precaution. This will only last long enough for us to sweep the building to ensure everyone is following the safety protocols for this drill. Staff will prepare the students well in advance so that it is not a surprise and so that they know what is expected. We will also ensure that students know that it is only a practice.
