Remembrance Assembly – Friday, November 10th @ 10:50

This Friday, students will be attending a Remembrance Assembly in advance of Remembrance Day. Some of our Grade 5 students and members of our choir will have prominent roles in this assembly. Thanks to Ms. Dube and Mr. Epp for their work to plan a student-centered program for our students. Parents are welcome to join us for this special assembly. Students are invited to wear their uniforms to school on Friday. Prior to the assembly, we will be distributing poppy stickers to all students. We will be collecting donations to support the Royal Canadian Legion with their annual Poppy Campaign and thank you in advance for your kind support.

Early Dismissal-Thursday, Nov. 23rd

Thursday, Nov. 23rd is a District-wide Early Dismissal day to allow an opportunity for first term learning conferences or Open Houses. Students will be dismissed at 11:38 am and buses will be running 3 hours early. Over the next week, your child's teacher will send home details of schedules and the format for upcoming classroom visits and/or conference opportunities. Some classes will be holding student-led conferences, while other classes will be having Open House visits. Some teachers may be reaching out to connect with parents for phone interviews at alternate times. As you can appreciate, these are short meetings to allow for all families to connect with the teachers. All meetings are intended to offer an opportunity for parents to check in with their child's teacher, hear of their child's strengths and areas for growth, and to review some goals together. Please continue to reach out directly to your child's teacher if you have concerns, questions, or information to assist us in supporting your child at school. We look forward to seeing you and celebrating your child's first term progress!

Communicating Student Learning

This year, the District has adopted a new process for reporting to parents. All teachers will be issuing learning updates online and we will not be sending paper copies home. At Hans Helgesen, all teachers will be reporting through MyEd and reports will be accessible online on Thursday, December 21st. Parents should already have access to MyEd through the Parent Portal. CBIEP Meetings

CBIEP stands for "Competency Based Individual Education Plan". Several students at school have a variety of Special Needs designations as determined through criteria set out by the Ministry of Education. A Ministry designation allows for a special team meeting within the first term of school which can include the student's parents, teacher(s), Educational Assistants, Inclusion Support team and some outside agencies. A student's Individual Education Plan outlines specific goals that children will work toward during the school year. These goals and strategies are reviewed and revised annually. Thank you to our Inclusion Support teachers, Ms. Tinisha Leung and Ms. Paula Leach for organizing and leading these CBIEP meetings with our HH families. We appreciate the supportive involvement of all staff and parents as we strive to create opportunities for all students to achieve success.

HH Concert 2024

We are looking forward to having a concert opportunity at Hans Helgesen in **late February 2024.** To ensure our District chairs, staging and equipment are available for concerts, our elementary schools are now part of a District calendar. Hans Helgesen had a December concert in 2022 and will have another opportunity for a winter concert next year. We are planning some special events in classrooms and around the school in December. Emergency Drills at School

At school, we regularly practice safety drills to address a variety of emergencies. So far, students have been practicing procedures for both **Fire Drills** and **Earthquake Drills**. We are doing an excellent job of evacuating the school quickly and quietly and staying with class line-ups for attendance. Staff work with students before, during and after these drills to talk through the steps and debrief about the process.

Soon, students will have opportunities to practice for both **Lockdown Drills** and **Hold and Secure Drills**. A "Lockdown" is a school safety procedure designed to keep students and staff safe in circumstances where there is a potentially dangerous event within the vicinity of the school. In a Lockdown Drill, students gather quietly in a safe and secure space within the room with their teacher and staff for the duration of the drill. A "Hold and Secure" procedure is a school safety procedure designed to keep students and staff safely contained within the school while a potential danger outside is being mitigated outside the school (ie- downed power lines, bear sighting on the property, etc.). In a Hold and Secure situation, the interior of the school continues to function, but we do not have people coming in and out of the building while there is an outside risk.

As students learn and practice these safety drills, we will continue to talk through the steps and the processes together in an age-appropriate manner. We want to ensure families have a heads up about the terminology we use for these safety drills, as you may hear of them at home. Thank you for reassuring your children that they are very safe at school!
